

OVERVIEW OF CDBG PROGRAM

- Grants to help "develop" the community
- Entitlement communities receive annual award on a formula basis
- Meridian divides funding into four (4) categories:
 - Admin (20% cap)
 - Public Services (15% cap)
 - Permanent Housing
 - Public Facilities and Infrastructure Improvements
- City typically funds 4-7 projects per year
- Specifically for Meridian residents

ELEMENTS OF CDBG PROGRAM

These are the main components of the CDBG Program that the City of Meridian is responsible for.

1 CONSOLIDATED PLAN

PLANNING & ANALYZING

Five-year plan that identifies housing and community development needs. Provides strategies to meet goals.

3 PROJECT IMPLEMENTATION

ACTIVITY

Service/activity provided to community. Staff involved in reimbursements, progress reports, monitoring, etc.

2 ACTION PLAN

ANNUAL GOALS

Identifies specific projects and actions to meet goals of Con Plan. Acts as application for funding.

4 CAPER

REPORTING

End of year report of accomplishments and progress toward goals identified in Con Plan.

ELIGIBLE APPLICANTS

Federal regulations only allow certain entities to apply for funds.



NON-PROFITS

Registered 501 (c) Organizations



Local Public Agencies/Entities

PROJECT CRITERIA

All projects must meet the criteria in each of these categories.

National Goal

- Provide decent, safe, and sanitary housing
- Provide a suitable living environment
- Expand economic opportunities
- Benefit low-moderate income persons
- Aid in the prevention or elimination of slums or blight

National Obj.

- Low/Mod Benefit
- Slum/Blight
- Urgent Need

CON PLAN GOALS

The following are goals identified in the Con Plan based on information collected during the Consolidated Planning process.

PUBLIC FACILITIES AND IMPROVEMENTS

Examples:

- Streetlights
- Sidewalks

HOUSING

Examples:

- Homeowner Repairs
- Homebuyer Assistance

PUBLIC SERVICES

Examples:

- Child Care Scholarships
- Emergency Payments



GRANT REQUIREMENTS

Nondiscrimination

All persons must be served equitably.

SAM Registration

System that ensures people using federal funding have not been disbarred.

3

Income Eligibility


Participants must be at or below 80% AMI.

Reporting

Monthly reports capture demographics, income, and progress.

October 1, 2024 to September 30, 2025




ANTICIPATED FUNDING
